While there are hearing churches everywhere, the Deaf Community has very limited access to a church where everything is "Deaf friendly" and where the Gospel is shared in their heart language. Many Deaf who would not attend a hearing church will attend a Deaf church where they have an opportunity to worship God and communicate with their pastor and fellow Christians directly. Even in churches with American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters, unfortunately much of the language is lost. It is important for members of the Deaf Community to receive ASL directly from teachers and leaders who have good signing skills. Mason's goal and passion is to provide the Deaf with a church where they can fluently communicate with the pastor and the other members, and where they can come to know Christ as their personal Savior, not hindered by the fact they cannot hear.

Oakwood Deaf Community Church began in 2012 with just 5 attending in Solon, Ohio. Bible study and church services were held at the local recreation center. Over time, the church began to grow and eventually began meeting in Willoughby, Ohio in the fellowship hall of Willoughby Bible Church. Three years later, Mason and his team planted a second Deaf

church in Westlake, Ohio bringing the number of Deaf churches in Ohio to a total of four. Mason hopes to see many more "Deaf friendly" churches and ministries grow and thrive in Ohio.

For more Deaf churches to be planted in Ohio and for new leaders to guide upcoming ministries.

"From Day One we have made it a ministry priority to become actively engaged with our community." says Josh McKinney, Church Planting Missionary and Lead Pastor of Commencement Church in Colerain Township, a community in the northern part of Cincinnati.

As God was impressing upon their hearts to begin a new work after 11 years of serving a legacy church in Cincinnati, Josh and Missy McKinney found themselves dreaming of the kind of church they wanted to be a part of and where they could raise their two sons. Missy shares, "We felt that it was a non-negotiable that the church that God was going to start be a church that rolled up their sleeves and served. That we served others and not only spoke to others about Jesus, but that we made it a priority to show them Jesus, too!" That is exactly what

Commencement has done. Through partnerships with local government, the local school district, and other local non-profits; Commencement has lived out one of its ministry mottos, to not just go to church, but to be the church. Commencement has brought back the local community Easter Egg Hunt, served free popcorn at Summer Movies in the Park, provided games and inflatables at community festivals, and introduced a new Fall Festival in the community. The church's partnership with a local elementary school has even given the church the opportunity to minister to teachers, administrators, and families in one of the lowest income areas of the township.
